General Rules and Regulations for Fair Participants and Attendees

The Cecil County Fair Board has authority and control over the operation, conduct and staging of the annual Cecil County Fair. To this end the following rules and regulations have been established to provide guidance to all participants.

- All reasonable precautions will be taken for the protection of people while on the Fairgrounds but the Board shall not be responsible for injury or illness to any person.
- 2. During the week of the fair, NO DOGS WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS, except as contestants in the dog show, pretty animal contest, or used as a seeing eye dog or aid dog. All service or therapy animals are required to have paper documentation.
- 3. The Fair Board reserves the right to interpret all rules and regulations and resolve any situation which may arise and is not restricted by the lack of a specific rule or regulation.
- 4. All reasonable precautions will be taken

for the protection of exhibits but the Board shall not be responsible for any loss or damage.

- 5. Premiums, prizes and awards will be paid to the exhibitor by mail within 60 days of the end of the Fair, unless otherwise stated in the class listing. Exhibitors not receiving their premium within 60 days should contact the Fair Secretary at (410) 392-3440. Checks must be cashed within 60 days of the date of issue or they will be void and the money will stay with the Cecil County Fair.
- The Fair reserves the right to reschedule or cancel any event without prior notice and without incurring any liability.
- 7. Animal exhibitors who need to stay overnight on the fairgrounds to care for stock, must have a special permission slip. This can be obtained from the Cecil County Fair Office. If you plan to participate in herdsman,

please see each section for specific rules.

- 8. Participants must comply with the Rules and Regulations listed for each department and section.
- 9. The Cecil County Fair Board encourages all 4-H and open class participants to market themselves and their products, but animals and products entered into the competition at the Fair are NOT to be sold and leave the fairgrounds during the Fair week.
- 10. Animals which are not entered in Fair classes will not be permitted on the fairgrounds at any time, for the health and safety of all exhibitors' animals. Please contact your barn chairperson if you have questions.
- 11. All service or therapy animals are required to have paper documentation.
- 12. Cecil County Fair is an alcohol free family friendly environment. Smoking in bleachers and buildings is prohibited. Please see Fair Map for

designated smoking areas.

- 13. The Cecil County Fair reserves the right to exclude from the fairgrounds any person (exhibitor, spectator, vendor, admission paying patron) who is in any manner disruptive or who exhibits inappropriate behavior that would disturb the public. Such behavior may include, but not be limited to, any public cursing, abusive, or belligerent language, or any language or conduct which causes others to feel threatened. The Fair may delegate authority to impose any such sanction to its designated security officers. Said sanction shall also include the right to temporarily or permanently ban participation in future events.
- 14. NO ADMISSION PASSES WILL BE FURNISHED. The exhibitor will be admitted free during official entry times only. All others accompanying an exhibitor must pay the regular admission price.

- All entries must be done online.

Create An Account

- All exhibitors must create an account with username and password. These accounts are good for any items that you want to enter before July 1.
- If you do not enter all of your items at once, be sure to use the same log-in information the next time to enter items. You will need username, e-mail address and password. If you forget your username or password it can be retrieved by clicking on "Forgot your Password?" at the bottom of the log-in screen.
- This account will not carry over to next year.

Create Your Entries

- You will need access to the online version of the Cecil County Fair Premium Book through our website cecilcountyfair.org or the paper version of the Premium Book.
- Select the Entries Tab and choose the Department, Section, and Class for your entry.
- After adding entry, a confirmation message appears to confirm the entry has been added.
- Most livestock class entries require additional information such as animal name, birthdate, etc. Registry # refers to your Breed Registration number, rabbit tattoo number, cavy tag number or your animal's 4-H Tag number for market and commercial tagged 4-H livestock. You are required to enter this information prior to saving the entry.

Review Entries

- Entries selected can be reviewed before
- Entries are considered pending until the "checkout" process is complete.

Checkout

- This is where entry process is completed. You do not need to checkout until all of your items have been entered even if it takes multiple days. However, be sure to checkout before the July 1 deadline or entries will not be accepted.
- All 4-H items are free to enter as well as Open Home Arts and Farm and Garden entries. Open Livestock has associated entry fees and must be paid with credit card. Additional credit card processing fees apply.
- Pay necessary fees, check the "Rules and Regulations" box and submit.
- A receipt of your entries will be sent to your e-mail.

Picking Up Entry Tags

- If you have many entries it is encouraged that you pick up your printed entry tags prior to the Fair.
 Only items entered in Home Arts and Farm and Garden need these printed tags.
- Printed entry tags for Home Arts and Farm and Garden items can be picked up





History of the Cecil County Fair

The Cecil County Fair originated in 1953, when members of the Calvert, Cecilton and Colora Granges met over lunch to discuss the idea. The founding members were Robert Carrion, Bill Groff, Walt Mason, and Ray Mueller, Cecil County's Agricultural Extension Agent at the time.

The group approached Mr. William DuPont, who owned the property known today as Fair Hill Natural Resources. Mr. DuPont welcomed the idea and was very supportive. In fact, he helped to share the expense of the fledgling fair throughout its first years, along with donating a grandstand and several outbuildings for displays and livestock.

In 1954, the first fair was held. It was a one-day event, held on July 27 from 10 a.m. to 10

p.m. Admission was completely free. Local individuals, organizations, businesses, as well as, the county commissioners provided the financial support.

There were approximately 752 entries from 204 open and 4-H exhibitors. Prizes were awarded in many categories, including home arts, food, flowers, produce, dairy, beef and horses.

Among the first exhibitors were the Grange, the Homemakers' Club and the Cecil County PTA. The midway consisted of just two booths – a dart and balloon game and baseball and bottle game! All comers walked away with a prize

Following a calf scramble, where the winner kept the calf, the evening's entertainment concluded with a performance by the North

East High School Band.

In the years that have followed, the fair – and Cecil County – have changed dramatically. More than 70,000 people attend the 9-day fair. The fair celebrates our agricultural heritage, while providing hands-on learning opportunities for children and adults to explore today's complex food chain – from animal to vegetable. Entertainment highlights include the ever-popular demolition derby, a professionally-sanctioned rodeo, tractor and truck pulls, plus countless competitions for 4-H youth and county residents to showcase their skills.

On behalf of the all-volunteer Fair Board, we want to thank you for attending the Cecil County Fair and sharing our rich history while helping us look to the future of farming!

4-H Livestock Sale

Please join us on Saturday, July 29 at Noon for the 41st Annual Cecil County Fair 4-H Livestock Sale. Livestock registration and Buyers Social will take place in Barn B, Farm & Garden, on July 29 starting at 11am. The Social will provide an assortment of refreshments for each registered buyer and give the 4-H youth the opportunity to discuss and point out the livestock they will be selling. This is your opportunity to support local 4-H Youth and to purchase some of Cecil County's finest hand raised beef, pork, lamb, chevon, rabbits, and chickens.

The Livestock Sale marks the culmination of months of hard work when 4-Hers offer their project animals for sale to the highest bidder. Proceeds often go to fund college educations. Buyers get the satisfaction of supporting hard working 4-H Youth, recognition for buying the best, and can usually deduct the cost as a business advertising expense.

Buyers of champion animals will have their pictures taken with their purchases to be published in a local newspaper. A banner will be presented to buyers of champion and reserve champion animals.

Even if you don't need a freezer full of meat, you can still support local 4-H Youth by buying an animal and returning it to the Sale Committee. The Sale Committee will sell the animal for you at the market price and all you'll owe is the difference between your bid price and the market price. You can expect around 600 lbs. of beef from a 1000 lb. steer, 175 lbs. of pork from a 250 lb. hog, 50 lbs. of lamb from a 100 lb. lamb, 40 lbs. of chevon from a 80 lb. goat. Prior to processing, broilers weigh over 5 pounds each, meat ducks weigh over 7 pounds each, and meat rabbits weigh 3-5 pounds each.

Don't need a whole steer, hog, goat, or lamb? Then bring a friend, split the meat and the cost. The Sale

Committee will make arrangements to transport your animal to a Cecil County processor, but buyers are responsible for processing costs.

To preview the animals, attend the Poultry Show on Saturday, July 22 at 3:00 p.m., the Rabbit Show on Sunday, July 23 at 9 a.m.; the Meat Goat Show on Monday, July 24 at 4:00 p.m., Sheep Show Tuesday, July 25 at 9 a.m.; and the Swine, Beef and Dairy Steer Shows on Wednesday, July 26, beginning at 9 a.m.

- 1. Sale is open to all active Cecil County 4-H Youth who are enrolled in a respective livestock project regardless of club membership. Youth who sell in 2023 are required to complete a record book with appropriate animal records in order to sell in 2024. Youth must write their thank you note to buyer and deliver it to April Barczewski on or before October 1, 2023, to be able to sell in 2024. Each youth may sell 2 animals of each species and no more than 3 animals total can be sold. Each animal must be registered as an official 4-H project. All youth selling in the 2023 sale are required to attend a mandatory sale meeting.
- Dates of Meetings:
 6/5/23 Calvert Grange, 7-8:30 PM
 6/7/23 Cecil County Farm Museum, 7-8:30 PM
- 3. All 4-H exhibitors must show their own animal, unless they have two animals in the same class. If two animals are in the same class, the exhibitor must show one of the animals and a person of

- their age or younger must show the other animal. In the case of illness or emergency, a group of at least 3 livestock sale committee members determine if a substitute show person is allowed. If a 4-H exhibitor does not show their own animal (unless one of the special exceptions stated apply) the exhibitor will not receive 4-H premiums and will not be allowed to sell in the 4-H Livestock Sale.
- 4. All market animals must meet the same eligibility rules as the shows to be sold.
- 5. Any rule not specifically stated here but listed on the individual show pages must be followed.
- 6. A 3% sales commission will be deducted to cover sale expenses.
- 7. The animal becomes property and responsibility of buyer once it is struck off at the sale. It will be cared for on the fairgrounds until all animals are released on Sunday morning. Arrangements for transportation to a Cecil County processor will

- be made but costs of processing are the buyer's responsibility.
- 8. The Cecil County Fair Livestock Sale Committee has the responsibility to sell all animals consigned to the sale.
- 9. Youth who have buyers interested in buying their returned animals are to take care of the transaction themselves.
- 10. The decisions of the Cecil County Fair Livestock Committee will be final.



Any vehicles with alterations can pull for exhibition only after safety standards are met.
- Operator must remain seated during pull and must have complete control of the tractor at all times. All tractors must have strong rigid seats. Operators demonstrating questionable driving skills will be challenged and track officials have the right to refuse to hook.
- No consumption of alcoholic beverages in the track or pit area either before or during the pull or contest.
- Any person who blocks the track with a tractor or other means during another tractor's pull for the purpose to delay or interfere with the tractor's pull OR who has been excused for disregarding any other rule will be eliminated from participation for one year and ten days. No one other than the track officials and drivers on their tractors are permitted on the track during a pull.
- The first tractor in each class has a choice of a 2nd pull. If the operator tries the second pull, they have to pull in the third

LAWN TRACTOR PULL RULES

- 1. Contest open to 2 wheel drive, rear wheel drive rubber tired tractors. No recapped tires, no dual wheels, no chains, studs or paddle tires permitted.
- All vehicles are subject to safety and rule compliance inspection by track officials.
- Any competitor refusing to have their vehicle inspected shall not be permitted to enter and/or pull in the class in question until legality is established.
- It is mandatory that all drivers attend the 13. drivers meeting held before the start of the event.
- No portion of the tractor may interfere with the hitch of the sled. The chain and kill switch cord must be easily hookable without inference. (Provided they don't cause interference, weight brackets/ weights may extend a maximum of 6 inches behind the rear tire)
- No vehicle can exceed 6 foot in length.

(Weights not included)

- Any weights can't exceed 8 feet forward from center of rear axle.
- Judgment calls by track officials are final and not subject to appeal. Any disputes may be handled after the pulling event is over in a friendly manner.
- All vehicles must be operated in a safe
- Any driver that wraps his or her fingers under the fender will be disqualified.
- Driver will remain in the seat for the duration of the pull event.
- Flagman can, and will stop, any pull attempt considered unsafe.
- Young drivers must show that they have experience operating the tractor they are about to pull. They will demonstrate this by driving the tractor safely to the weigh in scale and to the sled for hookup. A parent is expected to remain alongside their child during the process.
- At no time will a tractor be left running unattended.
- Drivers of stock tractors must wear closed toed shoes. All stock altered and

modified drivers must wear long pants, long shirt and closed toed shoes.

- 16. It is mandatory that stock altered and modified drivers wear DOT/SNELL rated helmets with chin straps fastened.
- All vehicles must have functional brakes and steering.
- Wheelie bars are recommended for all classes, but mandatory for stock altered/ modified tractors.
- All vehicles must have a drawbar that is stationary in all directions with hitching device not being more than 34 inches in

thickness, and must have a 1 ½ inch diameter opening. The pulling point may not be more than ½ inch from the back edge of the hitching device, parallel to and not more than 13 inches above ground.

Department 1: FOOD PRESERVATION

- 1. Canned goods must have been prepared since last year's show.
- 2. Jams, jellies, fruits, tomatoes (low acid tomatoes need acidification) and pickled vegetables should be processed in a boiling water bath canner. Vegetables, some tomatoes and pickles, must be processed in a pressure canner. To process the low-acid food safely in a reasonable length of time takes a temperature above the boiling point (240-250 degrees). Only tested recipes should be used. No substitutions or alterations in recipes should be made (Sources for tested recipes include USDA resources, So Easy to Preserve, Ball Blue Book, etc.).
- 3. All jars must have sealed lids with rings, jar, and lids. Must be clean and rust free.

- 4. Exhibitors are allowed only **one** entry per class. Duplicate entries in a class will disqualify the exhibitor in that class.
- All food preservation entries must be exhibited in clear glass, standard quart, pint, or 1/2 pint canning jars.
 Specific categories must be checked for the correct size jar. Products in tinted glass will not be judged. Use self-sealing jars approved by the National Center for Home 9. Preservation. All entries must be processed.
- 6. Judges may disqualify any jars which appear to contain artificial coloring (except mint jelly) and may eliminate any jars if the liquid is lower than levels suggested in the Ball Book, i.e. 1" for beets, corn, peas, and low acid foods, 1/2" for fruits and acid vegetables, 1/4" for juices, soft spread, pickles, relishes and jellies.
- Fancy packs are discouraged as being impractical because of the time needed to make such packs, and the greater chance of spoilage.
- 8. Label each jar clearly as to product name, processing method, and time for processing the jars (ex: tomatoes/boiling bath water bath/# of minutes). This applies to all classes in Department 1.
- 9. Judges may disqualify any jars that have the appearance of contents not prepared by exhibitor.
- 10. Contents of jar must be processed, and prepared for canning by the exhibitor.
- 11. Items should be canned / processed between July 23, 2022 July 20, 2023.
- 12. Jars may be opened during judging if necessary to determine quality of product

(Jars should be ½ pint standard clear canning jars and may be opened for judging) Label all products with product name, drying methods, and length of drying time.






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

- 10. To enter herdsman contest, you must enter online by July 1. If you are competing in a group, you must put that information along w/stall location request in the Entry Comment section of the online entry when you select he herdsman class for your species. Horse Herdsman must fill out a Decoration and Attractiveness of Exhibit (20%) separate form included in this book and mail it by July 1st.
- 11. All exhibits must be in place by 10pm on Sunday, July 23, Dairy: 6pm on Monday, July 25. Exhibits need to remain in place until 11pm on Saturday, July 29.

General Livestock Rules

- 1. Please refer to general fair rules listed earlier in this book.
- 2. Entries for all animal exhibits must be done online at cecilcountyfair.org by July 1.
- 3. Please see animal entry times listed on the following page.
- 4. Please see show attire rules on the following page.
- 5. Livestock exhibitors should use Fair Entrance 3.
- 6. Non-compliance with any Rule or Regulation may result in forfeiture of premiums.
- 7. Animals may not be removed from the grounds until 11:00 PM Saturday, July 29. Herdsman displays must not be taken down before 11:00 PM Saturday, July 29th. Premium money will be withheld from exhibitors not complying or if asked to leave by officials because of health problems. All animals must be removed from the grounds by 12 Noon Sunday, July 30th.
- 8. The Open Livestock Show is open to anyone in and outside of Cecil County.
- 9. All animals must meet state health regulations and must be accompanied by official health certificates. The self-certification form must be completed for each animal coming to the fairgrounds prior to check-in with the Animal Health Committee. The self certification form can be found at the MDA website. For information contact the MDA Animal Health Department at (410) 841-5810.
- 10. Any animal showing symptoms of any contagious or infectious disease, including ringworm, lice, warts or pink eye must be removed from the fair at the time of inspection. All decisions made by the health committee will be final.
- 11. Must have animal registration and health papers at all times.
- 12. Stalls and pens will be allocated on a space available basis and exhibitors must provide bedding for their animals and clean stalls. Exhibitors must bring their own bedding. Space is not guaranteed in the barns. All manure and bedding is to be piled in designated areas. Contestants who fail to comply with this rule will forfeit their premiums. Show committee reserves the right to dismiss an exhibitor if animals are not being cared for up to the standards of the committee. Please use fans sparingly in Barns D & E. Allowance and placement of fans is at the discretion of the barn chairpersons.

- 13. Each exhibitor is limited to 3 entries per Dairy Cow class and 2 entries per breeding livestock class.
- 14. Breeding classes are for breeding animals only, not market animals. All breeding animals must be registered in exhibitors name and have their association tags or tattoos in their ears.
- 15. Animals must be shown in market or breeding classes, can not be shown in both.
- Exhibitors are expected to keep their animals clean and under control at all times.
- 17. Every purebred animal must be owned and registered in the name of the exhibitor by the appropriate breed association, with exception of documented leases.
- 18. Market animal weights: Market Goats 55-135 lbs, Market Lambs 90-160 lbs, Market Hog 220-290 lbs; Market Steers and Dairy Steers over 1000 lbs.
- 19. The show committee of each species will make decisions regarding the conduct of the specific show and these decisions will be final. Classes may be combined or separated at the discretion of the department chairperson.
- 20. Trimming, blocking or squeeze chutes may only be used in areas designated by the Livestock Chairpersons. No other areas may be used.
- 21. All open animals must be registered in the name of the exhibitor 30 days prior to the Cecil County Fair Show. Certificates will be checked prior to show day. Breeding animals must have their association identification in their ears.
- 22. Exhibitors must comply with these rules and any other rules listed in the species section.
- 23. Entry fee must be submitted w/online entry, see species rules for amount.
- 24. Premiums will be paid to the person whose name is on the entries.
- 25. For champion selection, the first place animal in each class will be brought into the ring. It will be the judges discretion, if a second place animal will be brought in for reserve champion consideration. 4-H Champion will be chosen first, followed by Open Champion.
- 26. State fair class animals must be designated on entry, not put into that class day of show. Prior designation only.
- 27. All market animals will be weighed and divided into classes of approximately equal number at the discretion of the show chairperson.

4-H LIVESTOCK SHOW

Rules & regulations

- 1. There are no entry fees for Cecil County 4-Hers entering an exhibit in the 4-H Livestock Classes.
- 2. Fitting & Showing may be entered with either a breeding or market animal. You must show your own animal in Fitting and Showing class.
- 3. The 4-H ownership deadline is June 1 for breeding animals.
- 4. All 4-H market animals must be registered as a 4-H project by June 1st. Animals under or overweight can only be shown in Fitting & Showing and exhibition classes with no premiums. They cannot be sold in the sale. The 4-H market ownership deadline is May 15th.
- 5. All 4-H exhibitors must show their own animal, unless they have two animals in the same class. If two animals are in the same class, the exhibitor must show one of the animals and a person of their 4-H age or younger must show the other animal. In the case of illness or emergency, a group of at least 3 livestock sale committee members determine if a substitute show person is allowed. If a 4-H exhibitor does not show their own animal (unless one of the special exceptions stated apply) the exhibitor will not receive 4-H premiums and will not be allowed to sell in the 4-H Livestock sale.
- 6. Clovers may not enter in any 4-H classes.
- 7. 4-H animals may be used in judging practices throughout the week, with your cooperation.
- 8. Any animals registered to the 4-H may be used for Fitting and Showing. All exhibitors must show in Fitting and Showing in order to receive Herdsman premiums.
- Judging criteria for Fitting and Showing: fitting of animal, performance in the show ring, knowledge and personal appearance.
- 10. All animals shown in 4-H classes, must be fitted by the exhibitor only.
- 11. Each 4-H exhibitor must be enrolled in the animal project to be eligible to show and sell.
- 12. All exhibitors must abide by the Maryland 4-H Code of Animal Ethics.
- 13. If the exhibitor sold an animal in the Livestock Sale last year, they must have done a record book to be eligible to sell an animal this year.
- 14. All 4-H market animals must be shown in their species market show to be able to be in the Livestock Sale.
- 15. All 4-H market animals have to lead into the show ring to be shown and lead into the sale ring to be in the Livestock Sale.
- 16. Underweight or Overweight market animals are only eligible to show in Fitting and Showing or Exhibition Market Class. No premiums will be awarded for these classes. These animals are not eligible to be sold at the Livestock Sale.
- 17. All 4-H youth showing must participate in fitting and showing in order to be eligible for herdsman
- 18. There will be a Champion Challenge in Departments C-E, where past winners will compete against other past winners. Past champions in that species must enter this class, not their age division.

Cecil County Fair Animal Entry Times

No animals may arrive on Friday, July 21 besides horse showing the following day.

- All 4-H Market and Breeding Beef, Dairy Steers, Sheep, Swine, Meat Goats and Dairy Goats, and Rabbits & Cavies staying the duration of the fair must arrive between 7-11 AM or 2-4 PM on Saturday, July 22.

Show Attire Regulations for Exhibitors

The following prescribed show attire is required for all exhibitors in fitting and showing, breed classes, and market classes.

- No farm names or other identification shall appear on show uniforms.
- 2. Safe appropriate attire, including footwear, is required at all times. No open-toed shoes.
- No spaghetti straps, tank tops, or exposed midriffs.
- Shirts must be tucked in and no undergarments may be showing.
- Caps or other headwear shall not be worn in the show ring, except for protective headgear in the Horse Division.
- Cell phone or other electronic use by exhibitors is prohibited while exhibiting/ during his or her show time.

NOTE: Exhibitors not adhering to the show attire requirement will forfeit their premiums. Please note that neckpieces include: neck tie, bow tie, bolo tie, or a tied bandana. Jewelry does not qualify as a neckpiece - no exceptions. (Loose necklaces are not to be worn in the show ring). Girls may choose to wear a skirt of an appropriate length, instead of slacks. They must be in the appropriate color.

Dairy Cattle, Dairy Steers & Dairy Goats - White slacks with white shirt; neckpieces are optional.

Beef, Meat Goats, Sheep & Swine - Green or tan slacks, white or tan shirt with green or black neckpiece optional. Green, tan, or black suspenders also optional.

Horses - Appropriate riding clothes and headgear as defined in the MD 4-H Horse & Pony Rule Book, including ASTM helmets (a must).

Dogs - Attire that is suitable for showing a dog-Boys: slacks, shirt and tie; Girls: skirt or slacks and blouse or shirt.

Rabbit and Cavy - No open-toed shoes; plain polo, and school appropriate khaki shorts, skirt, shorts, pants, or capris. Show apron optional

Poultry; Small and Large Pets - No open-toed shoes; any appropriate shirt, jeans or slacks, skirt, or skorts accepted.

Pretty Animal - No open-toed shoes. Any appropriate attire or costumes. Helmet required for all mounted entries.

Seniors/children 6-12/\$3, children under 6/free) Exhibitors (anyone showing a horse/pony) will be given two (2) GATE passes and one (1) CAR pass to allow parking at the show barns. Pre-entry passes will be mailed to you. Every vehicle entering via Entrance 3 must have a car hang tag. Everyone in the vehicle entering the fairgrounds must have a gate pass. NO EXCEPTIONS!

2023 Cecil County Fair Golf Cart/UTV Safety Rules & Application

The following rules must be obeyed by all those using golf carts on the fairgrounds. At the first infraction of any of these rules, the driver of the golf cart may be denied permission to drive a cart for the duration of the fair.

- The owner of the Cart/UTV must agree to and sign the permit application form before a permit will be issued.
- Owners must show proof of insurance before a permit is 9. issued. A copy of this will be on file in the fair office. If you don't have insurance for your Golf Cart/UTV then you cannot operate it on the fairgrounds during the fair 10.
- Golf Cart's/UTV'S are NOT considered handicapped vehicles. Only wheelchairs and scooters are permitted
- All operator's MUST have a valid driver's license and be 11. Driving through the Mid-way (Carnival) is strictly 16 years old to operate on the fairground. NO **EXCEPTIONS**
- The operator of the Golf Cart/UTV is entirely responsible for the safe operations of their Golf Cart/ UTV. If it is viewed as being operated in an unsafe manner, it will result in loss of driving privilege for the rest of the fair.

- Any unauthorized Golf Cart/UTV, or similar vehicle being operated on the fairgrounds will be removed by the owner immediately. Failure to comply will result in having Golf Cart/UTV removed at the owner's expense.
- Permits must be kept in or on the cart at all times.
- All Golf Cart's/UTV's must have headlights for night time operations. Dusk is considered Night Time.
- "Four-Wheelers" are not considered a UTV and are not permitted to be operated on the fairgrounds during the
- The operation of the Cart's/UTV's need to be kept to a minimum. Preferably not before 6am or after 6pm. If the need arises to operate the cart/utv after 6pm, please contact Curt or Tom Tomlinson to get permission.
- 12. Operator of Golf Cart/UTV may transport supplies and people in the vehicle in a safe manner. Riding in bed is permitted as long as it's done so safely. Standing in the bed, riding on the sides, riding backwards on the dash of Golf Cart/UTV is prohibited.
- 13. The use of illegal drugs/alcohol is strictly prohibited

- while operating or riding in a Golf Cart/UTV.
- 14. Only those Golf Carts/ UTV'S authorized by the committee will be allowed to operate on fair property. The primary use of the Golf Carts/ UTV is for the operation and maintenance of the fair. If you have a specific reason for bringing one and wish to apply for a permit, then please complete the application for permit. It will be subject for approval or denial by the committee.
- 15. DO NOT park next to or between ANY of the 4-H barns. You may stop there to drop off supplies and such. There will be a designated Cart/UTV parking area established by the committee.
- The following do not need to register their Golf Cart's/ UTV's: Ice, trash, Maintenance, and Fair Board Member's.
- Cart's/UTV's that are being used in the pit area for the various pulls and shows MUST REMAIN in the pit area at ALL times. Please contact Curt or Tom Tomlinson if any issue arises in regards to this
- The Golf Cart/UTV committee chairperson has the final say and decision regarding any matter involving rules and regulations. NO EXCEPTIONS!

















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






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
