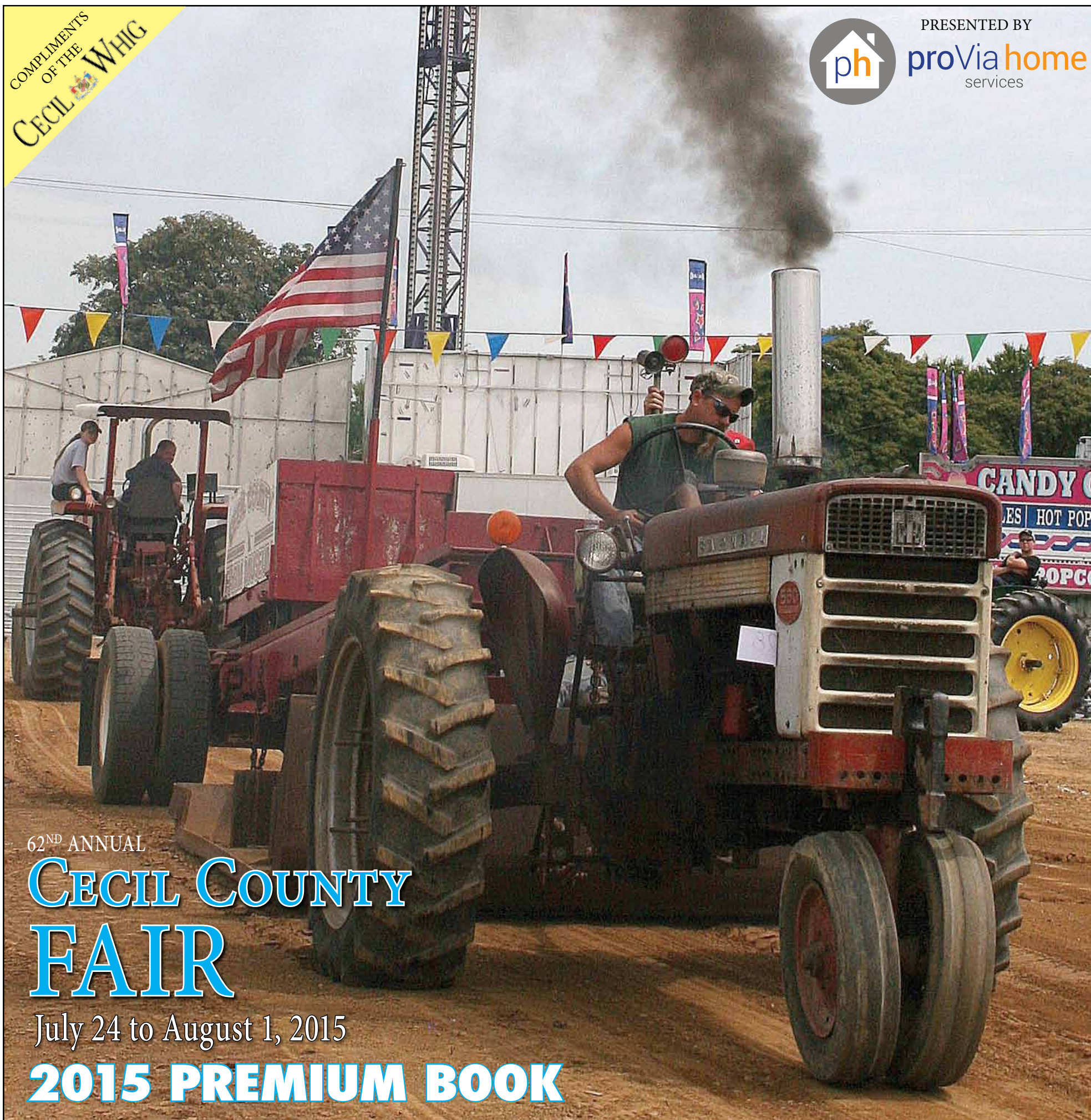

Please join us on Friday, July 31, 2015 at 6:00 for the 35th Annual Cecil County Fair 4-H Livestock Auction. This is your opportunity to support local 4-H Youth and to purchase some of Cecil County's finest hand raised beef, pork, lamb, chevon, rabbits, and chickens.

The Livestock Sale marks the culmination of months of hard work when 4-Hers offer their project animals for sale to the highest bidder. Proceeds often go to fund college educations. Buyers get the satisfaction of supporting hard working 4-H Youth, recognition for buying the best, and can usually deduct the cost as a business advertising expense.

Buyers of champion animals will have their pictures taken with their purchases to be published in a local newspaper. A banner will be presented to buyers of

champion and reserve champion animals.

Even if you don't need a freezer full of meat, you can still support local 4-H Youth by buying an animal and returning it to the Sale Committee. The Sale Committee will sell the animal for you at the market price and all you'll owe is the difference between your bid price and the market price. You can expect around 600 lbs. of beef from a 1000 lb. steer, 175 lbs. of pork from a 250 lb. hog, 50 lbs. of lamb from a 100 lb. lamb, 40 lbs. of chevon from a 80 lb. goat. Prior to processing, broilers weigh over 5 pounds each, meat ducks weigh 6 pounds each, and meat rabbits weigh 3-5 pounds each.

Don't need a whole steer, hog, goat, or lamb? Then bring a friend, split the meat and the cost. The Sale Committee will make arrangements to transport your

animal to a Cecil County processor, but buyers are responsible for processing costs.

To preview the animals, attend the Poultry Show on Saturday, July 25 at 4:00 p.m., the Rabbit Show on Sunday, July 26 at 9 a.m.; the Meat Goat Show on Monday, July 27 at 12:30 p.m., Sheep Show Tuesday, July 28 at 9 a.m.; and the Swine, Beef and Dairy Steer Shows on Wednesday, July 29, beginning at 9 a.m.

Livestock Sale Official Rules

1. Sale is open to all active Cecil County 4-H Youth who are enrolled in a respective livestock project regardless of club membership. Youth who sell in 2015 are required to complete a record book with appropriate market animal records in order to sell in 2016. Youth must write their thank you note to buyer and deliver it to April Barczewski on or before October 1, 2015, to be able to sell in 2016.
Each youth may sell 2 animals of each species and no more than 3 animals total can be sold. Each animal must be registered as an official 4-H project. All youth selling in the 2015 sale are required to attend a mandatory sale meeting.
2. Dates of Meetings:
May 19, Rising Sun Library, Rising Sun, 6:45 p.m.
June 3, Cecil County Extension Office, Elkton, 7 p.m.
3. All 4-H exhibitors must show their own animal, unless they have two animals in the same class. If two animals are in the same class, the exhibitor must show one of the animals and a person of their age or younger must show the other animal. In the case of illness or emergency, a group of at least 3 livestock sale committee members determine if a substitute show person is allowed. If a 4-H exhibitor does not show their own animal (unless one of the special exceptions stated apply) the exhibitor will not receive 4-H premiums and will not be allowed to sell in the 4-H Livestock sale.
4. All market animals must meet the same eligibility rules as the shows to be sold.
5. Any rule not specifically stated here but listed on the individual show pages must be followed.
6. A 5% sales commission will be deducted to cover sale expenses.
7. Animal becomes property and responsibility of buyer once it is struck off at the sale. It will be cared for on the fairgrounds until all animals are released on Sunday morning. Arrangements for transportation to a Cecil County processor will be made but costs of processing are the buyers responsibility.
8. The Cecil County Fair Livestock Sale Committee has the responsibility to sell all animals consigned to the sale.
9. Youth who have buyers interested in buying their returned animals are to take care of the transaction themselves.
10. The decisions of the Cecil County Fair Livestock Committee will be final.

History of the Cecil County Fair

The Cecil County Fair originated in 1953, when members of the Calvert, Cecilton and Colora Granges met over lunch to discuss the idea. The founding members were Robert Carrion, Bill Groff, Walt Mason, and Ray Mueller, Cecil County's Agricultural Extension Agent at the time.

The group approached Mr. William DuPont, who owned the property known today as Fair Hill Natural Resources. Mr. DuPont welcomed the idea and was very supportive. In fact, he helped to share the expense of the fledgling fair throughout its first years, along with donating a grandstand and several outbuildings for displays and livestock.

In 1954, the first fair was held. It was a one-day event, held on July 31 from 10 a.m. to 10

p.m. Admission was completely free. Local individuals, organizations, businesses as well as the county commissioners provided the financial support.

There were approximately 752 entries from 204 open and 4-H exhibitors. Prizes were awarded in many categories, including home arts, food, flowers, produce, dairy, beef and horses.

Among the first exhibitors were the Grange, the Homemakers' Club and the Cecil County PTA. The midway consisted of just two booths – a dart and balloon game and baseball and bottle game! All comers walked away with a prize.

Following a calf scramble, where the winner kept the calf, the evening's entertainment concluded with a performance by the North

East High School Band.

In the years that have followed, the fair – and Cecil County – have changed dramatically. More than 70,000 people attend the 9-day fair. The fair celebrates our agricultural heritage, while providing hands-on learning opportunities for children and adults to explore today's complex food chain – from animal to vegetable. Entertainment highlights include the ever-popular demolition derby, a professionally-sanctioned rodeo, tractor and truck pulls, plus countless competitions for 4-H youth and county residents to showcase their skills.

General Rules and Regulations for Fair Participants

The Cecil County Fair Board has authority and control over the operation, conduct and staging of the annual Cecil County Fair. To this end the following rules and regulations have been established to provide guidance to all participants.

1. All reasonable precautions will be taken for the protection of people while on the Fairgrounds but the Board shall not be responsible for injury to any person.
2. During the week of the fair, **NO DOGS WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS**, except as contestants in the dog show, pretty animal contest, or used as a seeing eye dog or aid dog.
3. The Fair Board reserves the right to interpret all rules and regulations and resolve any situation which may arise and is not restricted by the lack of a specific rule or regulation.
4. All reasonable precautions will be taken for the protection of exhibits but the Board shall not be responsible for any loss or damage.
5. Persons living in adjoining states who are and were enrolled in either a 4-H club or as a 4-H Volunteer in Cecil County on or before May 1, 2015 may enter.
6. Premiums, prizes and awards will be paid to the exhibitor by mail within 60 days of the end of the Fair, unless otherwise stated in the class listing. Exhibitors not receiving their premium within 60 days should contact the Fair Secretary at (410) 392-3440. Checks must be cashed within 60 days of the date of issue or they will be void and the money will stay with the Cecil County Fair.
7. Only one entry per exhibitor per class will be accepted. (Exceptions are stated in individual section rules.)
8. Every purebred animal must be owned and registered in the name of the exhibitor by the appropriate breed association, with exception of documented leases.
9. The Fair reserves the right to reschedule or cancel any event without prior notice and without incurring any liability except the return of any entry fee paid.
10. Only animal exhibitors who need to stay overnight on the fairgrounds to care for stock, must have a special permission slip. This can be obtained from the University of Maryland Extension 4-H Office. If you plan to participate in herdsman, please see each section for specific rules.
11. Participants must comply with the Rules and Regulations listed for each department and section.
12. Non-compliance with any Rule or Regulation may result in forfeiture of premiums. Stalls must be cleaned before your animals leave the fair grounds. Stalls will be checked and exhibitor will be cleared to leave by barn chair. Animals are NOT to leave the fair grounds AND herdsman is NOT to be taken down before 11:00p.m. on Saturday, August 1, 2015. Premiums will also be forfeited if a participant fails to clean up the area where an animal is kept.
13. **The Cecil County Fair Board encourages all 4-H and open class participants to market themselves and their products, but animals and products entered into the competition at the Fair are NOT to be sold and leave the fairgrounds during the Fair week. Animals which are not entered in Fair classes will not be permitted on the fairgrounds at any time, for the health and safety of all exhibitors' animals. Show Attire Regulations for Exhibitors

The following prescribed show attire is required for all exhibitors in fitting and showing, breed classes, and market classes.

1. No farm names or other identification shall appear on show uniforms.
2. Safe appropriate attire, including footwear, is required at all times. No open-toed shoes.
3. No spaghetti straps, tank tops, or exposed midriffs.
4. Shirts must be tucked in and no undergarments may be showing. No shorts will be allowed.
5. Caps or other headwear shall not be worn in the show ring, except for protective headgear in the Horse Division.
6. Cell phone or other electronic use by exhibitors is prohibited

while exhibiting/during his or her show time.

NOTE: Exhibitors not adhering to the show attire requirement will forfeit their premiums. Please note that neckpieces include: neck tie, bow tie, bolo tie, or a tied bandana. Jewelry does not qualify as a neckpiece - no exceptions. (Loose necklaces are not to be worn in the show ring).

Girls may choose to wear a skirt of an appropriate length, instead of slacks. They must be in the appropriate color.

Dairy Cattle, Dairy Steers & Dairy Goats - White slacks with white shirt; neckpieces are optional.

Beef, Meat Goats, Sheep & Swine - Green or tan slacks, white or tan shirt with green or black neckpiece optional. Green, tan, or black suspenders also optional.

Horses - Appropriate riding clothes and headgear as defined in the MD 4-H Horse & Pony Rule Book, including helmets (a must).

Dogs - Attire that is suitable for showing a dog - Boys: slacks, shirt and tie; Girls: skirt or slacks and blouse or shirt.

Rabbit and Cavy - No open-toed shoes; any appropriate shirt, jeans or slacks, skirt, or shorts accepted.

Poultry, Small and Large Pets - No open-toed shoes; any appropriate shirt, jeans or slacks, skirt, or shorts accepted.

Pretty Animal - No open-toed shoes. Any appropriate attire or costumes.

Tractor Pull Rules: Lawn Tractors

July 24, 2015 7:30pm

LAWN TRACTOR PULL RULES

1. Contest open to 2 wheel drive, rear wheel drive rubber tired tractors. No recapped tires, no dual wheels, no chains, studs or paddle tires permitted.
2. All vehicles are subject to safety and rule compliance inspection by track officials.
3. Any competitor refusing to have their vehicle inspected shall not be permitted to enter and/or pull in the class in question until legality is established.
4. It is mandatory that all drivers attend the drivers meeting held before the start of the event.
5. No portion of the tractor may interfere with the hitch of the sled. The chain and kill switch cord must be easily hook able without inference. (Provided they don't cause interference, weight brackets/weights may extend a maximum of 6 inches behind the rear tire)
6. No vehicle can exceed 6 foot in length.

(Weights not included)

7. Any weights can't exceed 8 feet forward from center of rear axle.
8. Judgment calls by track officials are final and not subject to appeal. Any disputes may be handled after the pulling event is over in a friendly manner.
9. All vehicles must be operated in a safe manner.
10. Any driver that wraps his or her fingers under the fender will be disqualified.
11. Driver will remain in the seat for the duration of the pull event.
12. Flagman can, and will stop, any pull attempt considered unsafe.
13. Young drivers must show that they have experience operating the tractor they are about to pull. They will demonstrate this by driving the tractor safely to the weight in scale and to the sled for hookup. A parent is expected to remain alongside their child during the process.
14. At no time will a tractor be left running unattended.
15. Drivers of stock tractors must wear closed

toed shoes. All stock altered and modified drivers must wear long pants, long shirt and closed toed shoes.

16. It is mandatory that stock altered and modified drivers wear DOT/SNELL rated helmets with chin straps fastened.
17. All vehicles must have functional brakes and steering.
18. Wheelie bars are recommended for all classes, but mandatory for stock altered/modified tractors.
19. All vehicles must have a drawbar that is

stationary in all directions with hitching devise not being more than ¾ inches in thickness, and must have a 1 ½ inch diameter opening. The pulling point may not be more than ½ inch from the back edge of the hitching device, parallel to and not more than 13 inches above ground.

20. A kill switch is mandatory for stock altered and modified.
21. Battery and fuel tank shall be fastened securely.

TRACTOR PULL RULES

1. Only tractor models in production from 1960 through 1972 will be eligible for this pull.
2. Pulling vehicles may only be entered ONCE unless otherwise announced.
3. Tractors must be operated in a safe manner at all times. A 5-mph speed limit will be enforced off the track. **Wheelie bars are encouraged but not mandatory.**
4. Operator must remain seated during pull and must have complete control of the tractor at all times. All tractors must have strong rigid seats. Operators demonstrating questionable driving skills will be challenged and track officials have the right to refuse to hook.
5. No consumption of alcoholic beverages in the track or pit area either before or during the pull or contest.
6. Operators may have two tries to pull sled before you go past 50 feet.
7. The first tractor in each class has a choice of a 2nd pull. If the operator tries 2nd pull, they have to pull in third position and accept the footage.
8. If you lose any parts or weights off your tractor during pull, you are disqualified.
9. Shut off switch must be operational from the driver's seat.
10. Pull at your own risk. All entry forms must be completed and signed. Any operators under the age of 18 must have the signature of a parent/guardian.
11. No hole digging or jerking of sled.
12. Engines, RPMs must NOT exceed factory standards plus 10%, factory fuel injection only, no multiple carbs and no nitrous oxide. All tractors must operate on pump fuel or the prescribed fuel for that engine. These standards will be checked. All pull vehicles will be open to inspection by track officials and must be proved by factory documentation. Any vehicles with alterations can pull for exhibition only after safety standards have been met.
13. Contest open to tractors with rubber tires, which may not be more than one size over factory standards. No cut tires, no 4-wheel drive, duals, tire studs, chains, steel or iron studs (except for factory steel).
14. Factory hood and fan shroud, or their equivalents, must be in place while pulling.
15. All tractors must have functional rear wheel brakes.
16. All pullers must wear shirts, shoes and pants.
17. Minimum drawbar length 18" from center of rear axle to point of hook, measured horizontally. Drawbar maximum height allowed is 20". The clevis or pulling hitch is not to be more than 1" thick, with a 3" diameter opening with a cross sectional thickness of a minimum 7/8". The pulling point may not be more than 1 1/2" from back edge of hitching device, and the drawbar must be rigid in all directions and parallel to the ground. All hitches must be unencumbered and accessible.
18. Front weights may not extend 30" past the front of tractor. Weights on rear are not to extend past rear of tire. All weights must be secured. No bolts shall extend more than 2 inches past last weight or tire.
19. Any person who blocks the track with a tractor or other means during another tractor's pull for the purpose of delaying or interfering with the tractor's pull or has been excused for disregarding any other rule will be eliminated from participation for one year and ten days. No one other than the track officials and drivers on their tractors are permitted on the track during a pull.
20. Trophies and ribbons only. There are no cash awards.
21. Entry fees will be \$10 per entry unless otherwise announced.
22. While in the staging area each tractor must have someone in attendance.
23. The top 3 tractors in each class may be asked to reweigh and have engine RPM's checked.
24. All protests of tractors must be made to officials immediately after said tractor has completed its pull with a \$25 complaint fee. The protester must pull in the same class as the questioned tractor. If upon inspection by track officials, the questioned tractor is proved to be illegal, the protester is refunded the \$25. If upon inspection by track officials, the questioned tractor is proved legal, the \$25 will be forfeited to the CCFM.

1. Only tractor models in production prior to 1960 will be eligible for this pull.
2. Pulling vehicles may only be entered ONCE unless otherwise announced.
3. Engines, RPMs must NOT exceed factory standards plus 10%, factory fuel injection only, no multiple carbs and no nitrous oxide. All tractors must operate on pump fuel or the prescribed fuel for that engine. These standards will be checked. All pull vehicles will be open to inspection by track officials and must be proved by factory documentation, the burden of proof falls on the operator. Any vehicles with alterations can pull for exhibition only after safety standards are met.
4. Operator must remain seated during pull and must have complete control of the tractor at all times. All tractors must have strong rigid seats. Operators demonstrating questionable driving skills will be challenged and track officials have the right to refuse to hook.
5. No consumption of alcoholic beverages in the track or pit area either before or during the pull or contest.
6. Any person who blocks the track with a tractor or other means during another tractor's pull for the purpose to delay or interfere with the tractor's pull OR who has been excused for disregarding any other rule will be eliminated from participation for one year and ten days. No one other than the track officials and drivers on their tractors are permitted on the track during a pull.
7. The first tractor in each class has a choice of a 2nd pull. If the operator tries the second pull, they have to pull in the third

11000 LB. PRO FARM STOCK RULES

1. Competition vehicles must have standard block and crankcase for make and model being entered. Repower engines must use original equipment size and type injection pump for the tractor being entered or injection pump must be maximum of one "a" line pump (german bosch, one plunger per cylinder). No p-pumps. Tractor identification is to be by transmission, rearend and chassis size with stock appearance. Hood, side shields, & etc may be updated to make of tractor. Tractors must have wide front axles. Front wheels must track within rearwheels. Must have steel flywheel and clutch components. No cast parts allowed in clutch system.
2. Engine cubic inch limit of 540 CID.
3. Vehicles must have oem cylinder head and must be for series engine used—no recast, no aluminum, no over head cams allowed.
4. Diesel tractors only. Diesel fuel only. No accelerants.
5. Intercoolers and water injection allowed. No alcohol.
6. Turbocharger must be under hood. See drawing below for maximum turbo charger size. Turbo charger must have a 2.4 maximum inlet bore at the compressor

7. wheel, or a restrictor plate 1/4" thick with a hole no larger than 2.4" in diameter within 2" of compressor wheel. There must be only one turbo going through one pressure stage. Exhaust must discharge vertically upward above highest point of tractor; with exception of roll bars; and must be securely attached. Exhaust must be at least 18" above the hood and no curved pipes or rain caps allowed. Exhaust pipe must be cross-bolted with two 3/8" grade five bolts within 1" of each other in vertical pipe and two 5/16" bolts within one inch of exhaust housing.
8. Vehicle with a plastic or fiberglass hood must be shielded in the turbo area with a minimum metal thickness of .060" or 1/6". Largest exhaust housing largest compressor housing
9. All engine fans must be shrouded with steel 1/16" or thicker, 360 degrees or factory.
10. Minimum drawbar length of 18" from center of rearwheels to point of hook. Drawbar must be rigid in all directions with maximum 20" from top of hitch to the ground. Drawbar must be parallel to the ground. Hitch must be horizontal—not vertical. No cast iron drawbar components. Draw bar must be horizontally pinned.
11. All tractors will require:
 - A. Air shut off—must also be able to be operated manually (by the operator from the seat of the tractor).

- B. Flywheel protection in the form of either.
 1. A scatter blanket with six straps.
 2. 6" X 3/8" steel, 360 degrees around the flywheel area.
 - C. Rear wheelie bars installed in accordance with the following specs.
 1. Pads on bottom of bars to be a minimum of 5 in. Sq. Pads.
 2. Pads to be a minimum of 32" rearward from the center of the rearend housing.
 3. Pads maximum of 10" off the ground.
 4. Outside to outside width of pads to be a minimum of 20"
 5. Minimum 12" high bumper bars—top to be fastened to stabilizer bar framing.
 6. Bars must support weight of tractor for weight class being pulled.
 - D. Deadman's throttle.
 - E. Neutral light—light must come on in neutral & start in neutral with light on.
 - F. Side shields are allowed and must be made out of .060" Or 1/16" metal.
 - G. Harmonic balancer to be shielded to be contained in vehicle.
12. Maximum tire width is to be 24.5" Us. Or 650 x 65 metric. Maximum rim diameter of 38". No cut tires or puller 2000 h.p. No

- alterations to front edge of bar, tread, or cleat of tires.
13. Removal of pto or hydraulics (rockshafts) allowed—if not removed pto shafts must be covered with a safety shield.
14. The frame and weights must not extend any further than 12' from center of the rear axle to further most point—excluding tow hook. The wheelbase must not exceed 114"
15. Competing vehicles must have working rear wheel brakes.
16. Competing vehicles must have fenders that consist of a solid barrier between the driver and any part of the rear tires. The barrier must be able to sufficiently support the weight of the driver and must extend a minimum of 6" horizontally at the top, and be a minimum of 36" wide at the top.
17. Vehicle must have a rollover protection bar or cage that is at least as high as the top of the drivers head/helmet. Rollover protection must be fastened at least two points to the rear axle housing. Factory style flip down tops allowed. Rollover protection must be able to lift one rear wheel when pulled horizontally from the top of the bar/cage without damage to the rollbar/cage.
18. Top 3 finishing tractors are subject to inspection.
19. Driver must wear fire suit and helmet.
20. Fire extinguisher is required.

Kiddie Garden Tractor Pull

The kiddie garden tractor pull is for youth aged 13 and under. Tractor in this pull are STOCK only. Rules are VERY STRICTLY ENFORCED.

Entries must be entered on Friday, July 24, from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m and Saturday, July 25 from 8 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Perishable items (baked goods) should be entered Saturday, July 25 from 8 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. Exhibitors showing 10 items or more must enter by 10:30 a.m. Building will be closed for the rest of the day for judging at 11:00 a.m. Only authorized persons will be permitted in the exhibit area while judging is in progress. Building will reopen Sunday, July 26, 2015 at 12 p.m.
2. If entering 5 or more items, please obtain entry tags in advance. Entry tags are available at the Cecil County Extension Office between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.
3. NO ADMISSION PASSES WILL BE FURNISHED. Exhibitors will be admitted free during official entry times specified above, through any gate. All others accompanying an exhibitor must pay the regular admission price.
4. Entries in all sections must be the work of the exhibitor, owned by the exhibitor, and entered in his or her name.
5. There is no age limit, unless specified in a class.
6. Only one entry per class will be accepted from any one exhibitor.
7. All entries must be fresh, clean and conform to size or content specifications.
8. All work must have been completed since last year's Cecil County Fair except as noted in specific section listings. No entry exhibited in a previous Cecil County Fair is eligible for competition.



9. Competent judges will be selected and their decisions will be final. Department 1: FOOD PRESERVATION

- Canned goods must have been prepared since last year's show.
- Jams, jellies, fruits, tomatoes (low acid tomatoes need acidification) and pickled vegetables should be processed in a boiling water bath canner. Vegetables except tomatoes and pickles must be processed in a pressure canner. To process the low-acid food safely in a reasonable length of time takes a temperature above the boiling point (240-250 degrees). Only tested recipes should be used. No substitutions or alterations in recipes should be made (Sources for tested recipes include USDA resources, [So Easy to Preserve](#)).
- All jars must be clean and have lids and rings with no rust. Rust will disqualify exhibit.
- Exhibitors are allowed only one entry per class. Duplicate entries in a class will disqualify the exhibitor in that class.
- All food preservation entries must be exhibited in clear glass, standard quart, pint, or 1/2 pint canning jars. Specific categories must be checked for the correct size jar. Products in green tinted glass will not be judged. Use self-sealing jars only, i.e. Ball, Kerr, Mason, etc. Paraffin is not to be used. All entries must be processed.
- Judges may disqualify any jars which appear to contain artificial coloring (except mint jelly) and may eliminate any jars if the liquid is lower than levels suggested in the Ball Book, i.e. 1" for beets, corn, peas, and low acid foods, 1/2" for fruits and acid vegetables, 1/4" for juices, soft spread, pickles, relishes and jellies.
- Fancy packs are discouraged as being impractical because of the time needed to make such packs, and the greater chance of spoilage.
- Label each jar clearly as to product name, processing method, and time for processing the jars (ex: tomatoes/boiling bath water bath/# of minutes). This applies to all classes in Department 1.
- Judges may disqualify any jars that have the appearance of contents not prepared by exhibitor.
- Contents of jar must be processed, and prepared for canning by the exhibitor.
- Items should be canned / processed between August 1, 2014 - July 24, 2015.

- The Cecil County Fair is not responsible for damage to artwork or frames exhibited. Remember that exhibits are housed in a barn for the week.
- Each exhibitor limited to a total of 6 entries, each entry must be in a different class. (4-Her's may enter up to 6 in Open, and 6 in 4-H).
- All fine art entries should be protected to prevent smudge, damage, etc.
- Entries that have won at previous contests are not eligible for entry.
- Entries are limited to original paintings and drawings, in all media!

5. Please have the driver of each float and one adult representative from each walking unit report to the fair board office 10 minutes before the parade so that we can walk through the course that we are taking.
6. If your unit gets out of line, you will be disqualified. (Unless you have a reasonable excuse for getting out of line.)

2. All animals entries must be postmarked by the deadline date listed on entry form. The entries must contain all fees required for class.
3. Animals must be on the grounds by Saturday, July 25, 2015 at 4 p.m. The only exception to this is dairy.
4. Animals may not be removed from the grounds until 11:00 p.m. Saturday, August 1, 2015. Herdsman must not be taken down before 11:00 p.m. Saturday, August 1, 2015. Premium money will be withheld from exhibitors not complying or if asked to leave by officials because of health problems.
5. NO ADMISSION PASSES WILL BE FURNISHED. Exhibitors will be permitted to enter during official entry times; however, anyone accompanying exhibitor will be required to pay appropriate admission charges. Livestock exhibitor vehicle hangtags only allow the vehicle to be parked, it does not furnish entry of people in vehicle.
6. All animals exhibited must comply with the regulation of the Maryland Department of Agriculture - Animal Health Section. For information contact the MDA Animal Health Section (410) 841-5810. Health Regulation papers will be checked before the show by an appropriate, certified representative. All decisions made by the representative will be final.
7. Horses and livestock must be removed from the grounds by 2 p.m. Sunday, August 2, 2015.
8. All manure and bedding is to be piled in designated areas. Contestants who fail to comply with this rule will forfeit their premiums.
9. Clovers may not enter in any 4-H Livestock or Horse and Pony Classes.
10. 4-H animals may be used in judging practices throughout the week, with your cooperation.
11. All 4-H exhibitors must show their own animal, unless they have two animals in the same class. If two animals are in the same class, the exhibitor must show one of the animals and a person of their age or younger must show the other animal. In the case of illness or emergency, barn chairs for sections A-E will determine if a substitute show person is allowed. If a 4-H exhibitor does not show their own animal (unless one of the special exceptions stated apply) the exhibitor will not receive 4-H premiums and will not be allowed to sell in the 4-H Livestock Sale.



OPEN SHOW

Rules & regulations

1. The Open Livestock Show is open to anyone in and outside of Cecil County. Refer to entry form in back of book for entry fees.
2. All animals must meet state health regulations and must be accompanied by official health certificates. Any animal showing symptoms of any contagious or infectious disease, including ringworm, warts or pink eye must be removed from the fair at the time of inspection. The self-certification form must be completed for each animal coming to the fairgrounds prior to check-in with Animal Health Committee.
3. Stalls and pens will be allocated on a space available basis and exhibitors must provide bedding for their animals and clean stalls. Space is not guaranteed in the barns. Stalls not cleaned will not receive premiums.
4. Exhibitors are expected to keep their animals clean and under control at all times.
5. The show committee of each species will make decisions regarding the conduct of the specific show and these decisions will be final.
6. Trimming, blocking or squeeze chutes may only be used in areas designated by the Livestock Chairpersons. No other areas may be used.
7. All animals must be registered in the name of the exhibitor 30 days prior to the Cecil County Fair Show. Certificates or bill of sale will be checked prior to show day. Breeding animals must have their association tags in their ears.
8. Classes may be combined or separated at the discretion of the department chairperson.
9. Refer to species section for arrival times.
10. Exhibitors must comply with these rules and any other rules listed in the appropriate section.
11. Please see general rules for appropriate show attire.
12. Please read specific animal departments, as they also apply.

4-H SHOW

Rules & regulations

1. There are no entry fees for Cecil County 4-Hers entering an exhibit in the 4-H Livestock Classes.
2. Fitting & Showing may be entered with either a breeding or market animal.
3. Each exhibitor is limited to 2 entries per breeding livestock class. All animals must meet state health regulations and must be accompanied by official health certificates.
4. All 4-H Livestock animals must be on the grounds by 4 p.m. Saturday, July 25, 2015 and will be released Saturday, August 1, 2015 at 11:00 p.m.
5. Breeding classes are for breeding animals only, not market animals. All breeding animals must be registered in exhibitors name and have their association tags or tattoos in their ears. The 4-H ownership deadline is June 1 for breeding animals.
6. All market animals must be tagged with Maryland 4-H Livestock Tags. Market animal weights: Market Goats 55-135 lbs, Market Lambs 90-155 lbs, Market Hog 220-290 lbs; Market Steers over 1000 lbs. Animals under or over weight can only be shown in Fitting & Showing and exhibition classes with no premiums. They cannot be sold in the sale. The 4-H market ownership deadline is May 15, 2015.
7. Exhibitor must comply with these rules and any other rules listed in their appropriate section.
8. All 4-H exhibitors must show their own animal, unless they have two animals in the same class. If two animals are in the same class, the exhibitor must show one of the animals and a person of their 4-H age or younger must show the other animal. In the case of illness or emergency, a group of at least 3 livestock sale committee members determine if a substitute show person is allowed. If a 4-H exhibitor does not show their own animal (unless one of the special exceptions stated apply) the exhibitor will not receive 4-H premiums and will not be allowed to sell in the 4-H Livestock sale.
9. Please see general rules for appropriate show attire.
10. Please read specific animal departments, as they also apply.

Rules and Regulations:

1. All exhibitors must comply with General Rules and 4-H Rules, previously listed in this book.
2. Pre-entry on the appropriate form is required (with fee if applicable) and is due to 2677 Telegraph Road, North East, MD 21901.
3. All Breeding Sheep must be owned by the exhibitor and registered in the exhibitor's name by June 1, 2015.
4. Market lambs must weigh a minimum of 90 lbs. and a maximum of 155 lbs. Lambs under or over these weights are only eligible for fitting and showing classes. No premiums will be awarded for these classes. These animals are not eligible to be sold at the Livestock Auction.
5. Ewes may be entered in market lamb classes, but any ewe entered in breeding classes will not be eligible for market lamb classes.
6. All shavings or straw (recommended) must be disposed of properly in specified areas. Anyone not disposing of waste properly will forfeit premiums.
7. All animals will be weighed and divided into classes of approximately equal number at the discretion of the show chairperson.
8. For champion selection, the first place animal in each class will be brought into the ring. It will be the judges discretion, if a second place animal will be brought in for reserve champion consideration. 4-H Champion will be chosen first, followed by Open Champion.
9. All 4-H lambs/sheep must arrive on grounds by 4 p.m. on Saturday, July 25, 2015. Open lambs/sheep must arrive on Fairgrounds by 11:30 a.m. on Tuesday, 28, 2015, and will be released immediately after the show. If these times are not strictly adhered to animals will not be allowed on the grounds and/or premium money could be forfeited.
10. Any sheep or lamb that exhibits a rectal prolapse at a 4-H activity will be ineligible for the activity and sent home by the Extension Educator, Sheep Superintendent, or other appropriately deemed individual. The following will be used as a guideline to determine occurrence of a rectal prolapse:
"A rectal prolapse is defined as an inversion of the rectum that protrudes 4 cm (1.6 in.) or more outside the body and remains exterior to the body while the animal is standing."
If a lamb is observed with a rectal prolapse (by one of the above people) and in the future is not observed with a rectal prolapse, it is still classified as having a rectal prolapse. Horse shows are a part of the Cecil County Fair. All spectators entering the fair grounds must pay a gate fee. (Adult/\$5. Seniors/children 6-12/\$2, children under 6/free) Exhibitors (anyone showing a horse/pony) will be given two (2) GATE passes and one (1) CAR pass to allow parking at the show barns. (Pre-entry passes will be mailed to you.) Every vehicle entering via Entrance 3 must have a car hang tag..... Everyone in the vehicle entering the fair grounds must have a gate pass. NO EXCEPTIONS! Extra gate and car passes may be ordered with your entry. Please include quantity of each and a SEPARATE CHECK made out to Cecil County Fair. If you enter more than 1 show, you may only received 2 gate passes & 1 car pass. If you need additional passes, please contact Monica Mason or Elaine Rea-Whited during the fair for additional passes.

- Pre-entry fees are \$10 per class. Post-entry fees are \$12.00. Pre-entries Will NOT be accepted after midnight July 01, 2015. NO EXCEPTIONS. Please make all checks payable to C.C.F.. all checks must have the driver's license number of the account holder legibly written on the check.
- No entry can be accepted without a copy of a CURRENT (within 12 months of the show date), legible, negative coggins test and a MDA Equine Self Certification Certificate. The certificate can be found online at www.mda.state.md.us/animalhealth/fair_show/pdf/equine_exhibitor_self_certification.pdf. Entries sent without a current, legible, negative coggins test will be considered incomplete, and will not receive the pre-entry discount. A negative coggins is not required for animals under six years of age.
- A refund for scratched classes requires a vet certificate. There is no refund for missed classes. a one minute wait call will be enforced in all rings. Change of horse or rider from original entry is considered a scratch.
- Post-entries must be made at least 3 classes in advance.
- Classes may be split or combined at the discretion of the Cecil County Fair Horse Show Committee.
- The use of martingales is prohibited in all under saddle classes, tie-breaking classes, and ALL pleasure classes.
- Any rules not covered in this section will be interpreted by the USEF rulebook.
- Leadline riders are seven years old and younger. Leadline riders are not eligible for any other classes.

- All jump heights are approximate.

Horse shows are a part of the Cecil County Fair. All spectators entering the fair grounds must pay a gate fee. (Adult/\$5. Seniors/children 6-12/\$2, children under 6/free) Exhibitors (anyone showing a horse/pony) will be given two (2) GATE passes and one (1) CAR pass to allow parking at the show barns. (Pre-entry passes will be mailed to you.) Every vehicle entering via Entrance 3 must have a car hang tag. Everyone in the vehicle entering the fair grounds must have a gate pass. NO EXCEPTIONS! Extra gate and car passes may be ordered with your entry. Please include quantity of each and a SEPARATE CHECK made out to Cecil County Fair. If you enter more than 1 show, you may only receive 2 gate passes and 1 car pass. If you need additional passes, please contact Monica Mason or Elaine Rea-Whited during the fair for additional passes.

- Pre-entry fees are \$10 per class. Post-entry fees are \$12.00. Open and 4-H pre-entries WILL NOT be accepted after midnight July 1, 2015. NO EXCEPTIONS. Please make all checks payable to C.C.F. All checks must have the driver's license number of the account holder legibly written on the check.
- No entry can be accepted without a copy of a CURRENT (within 12 months of the show date), legible, negative coggins test and a Mda Equine Self Certification Certificate. - Alumni are former 4-Hers that are over the age of 18 as of January 01, 2015.
- Grooming and Showmanship points count for horsemanship championships.
- All herdsman participants must enter the appropriate showmanship classes.
- Rider and horse combinations are permitted to enter 3 mounted divisions. These include horsemanship, performance, and speed division. Equitation divisions are Beginner, Junior, intermediate, and Senior. Performance are Junior Horse and Senior Horse.
- After the speed classes, GAMES ON HORSEBACK WILL NOT BEGIN BEFORE 1 P.M. and may be ridden in western or english tack and attire. Anyone entering the speed/games classes must have a secured chin strap and covering on the arms by shirt or other protective clothing.

6. Clovers may not enter any 4-H animal classes.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Open entry fee \$.50 per bird. No entry fee for 4-H birds. No entry will be accepted without POULTRY ENTRY BLANK completed and signed by exhibitor, and proper entry fee. Entries close July 1, 2015. Positively no late entries. The Fair reserves the right to return any entry.
2. Birds will be housed in the POULTRY BUILDING UNTIL AUGUST 1, 2015
3. The show is only open for birds that reside in Maryland or are a current Cecil County 4-Her. Birds that reside out of state (for Cecil County 4-H members only) must be tested in their own state prior to coming to the show.
4. Exhibitors are responsible for maintaining and keeping their exhibits clean, feeding and watering their exhibits.
5. All birds shown must be property of the exhibitor by June 1, 2015, except Market.
6. All birds judged according to rules in the Standard of Perfection of the American Poultry Association.
7. No cards or inscriptions will be allowed on coops until after the judging has been completed. Placing birds will then be assigned a coop for the week.
8. The exhibits are being shown at the sole risk of the exhibitor. The greatest care will be taken with all exhibits; however, the Show will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage while on the fairgrounds.
9. Exhibits cannot be removed from the building until 11:00 p.m., Saturday, August 1.
10. Show subject to cancellation due to AVIAN INFLUENZA.
11. Birds must be tested prior to show for Pullorum-Typhoid and Avian Influenza (out-of-state birds only).
12. All birds must have the proper leg band to be shown. Without the proper band your bird will be disqualified and must leave the fairgrounds.
13. This will be an open exhibit show — you must be present to show your birds.
14. All exhibitors must be present to show their birds.
15. Birds must be kept in proper cages as they arrive on the fairgrounds day of the show. No birds will be allowed to be caged in the Poultry Building until after the show.
16. Birds will be handled and brought to the show table where they will be caged until the judge is finished and places the class.
17. Judging will take place for each class individually unless other wise combined by the judge of the show.
18. Birds may be shown in 4-H and open classes.
19. If birds are entered into the wrong class they can be disqualified from the show.
20. Any bird unclean or unfit will be disqualified from the show.
21. Any bird without a proper leg band will be disqualified from the show
22. Any discrepancies or issues that arise will be handled by the show Co-Chairpersons - any disputes or misconduct on behalf of an exhibitor can result in disqualification from the show arena.
23. If staying at fair, you must provide your own food and bedding.
24. Market Broiler and Market Duck exhibitors must submit a copy of market order receipt/shipping label with entry.

Out-of-State Bird Instructions

1. Obtain a Poultry Premises Registration Number.
2. Valid copy of Avian Influenza test.
3. Valid copy of Pullorum-Typhoid test.
4. All poultry exhibitors must fill out a Self Certification of Poultry Health (located in back of book with entry form) prior to loading animals and shall be presented upon request to the designated fair and show representative at each show attended.

- Open participation to anyone in or outside of Cecil County.
- No entry will be accepted unless presented in writing, upon the proper entry blank and signed by the exhibitor. NO PHONE ENTRIES. Proper entry fee must accompany form or you will not be able to show.
- Entry fee is \$.50 per open entry. Feeding fee is \$.50 per rabbit. 4-Hers will show open and 4-H.
- Rabbits will be housed in the Rabbit Building and must be in place by 8 a.m. on Saturday, July 25, 2015
- Guinea Pigs will be released to their exhibitors following the show. None will stay in barn for the week.
- Entry forms must be filled out completely, including breed, sex, tattoo number and age of animal. This is as given in the latest edition of the American Rabbit Breeders Association Standard of Perfection. This and rules may be obtained by writing to: American Rabbit Breeders Association, 1401 East Oakland Avenue, Bloomington, IL 61701.
- All animals must be the sole property of the exhibitor.
- All exhibitors must participate in the daily care of the animals. A schedule will be made when you enter.
- The greatest care will be taken for all animals, but the show will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage from whatever arises. All animals shall be exhibited in their natural condition.
- No cards or inscriptions will be allowed on coops until after judging has been completed.
- A meat class is comprised of 3 rabbits not less than 3 lbs. and not over 5 lbs. each. Uniformity is a must.
- All animals will be checked the day of the show. Any stock showing signs of disease will be removed from the show. Please stay with animals until check-in and in proper coops.
- Show official's word is final. Anyone disagreeing in abusive or unpleasant manner will have rabbits removed from show and premiums will be forfeited.
- No Does with litters or pregnant Does will be allowed in show.
- No animals under 3 months old.
- Exhibits can NOT be removed until 12:01 a.m. mid-night, Sunday, August 2, 2015. Release of rabbits due to extremely hot weather will be at the discretion of show Chairman with the approval of the Fair Board.
- All exhibitors must clean cage daily and dispose of refuse properly. This will be strictly enforced.
- Ribbons and awards will be presented after the show on Sunday, July 26, 2015
- Rabbits must be permanently earmarked in the left ear one week prior to show. If any questions, please contact Mary Cooling (410) 708-3905 evenings. 4-Hers will not be charged for this service.
- No more than 4 entries per individual per class.
- Exhibitors will be responsible for bringing food and water containers that cannot flip.
- Meat rabbits must be under 70 days of age and weigh between 3 and 5 pounds each.
- As with any 4-H animal project, your rabbits are your responsibility. 4-H members are required to clean their cages daily. Un-kept cages will result in the removal of the rabbit(s) from the fairgrounds. If your animals are asked to be removed it may result in the loss of your premium money. Your rabbit projects are on display for the public; if you cannot make the commitment to care for your rabbits you need to make other arrangements.
- Exhibitors must complete a self certification of rabbit/cavy health form and present it to the animal health committee upon arrival/entry to the fairgrounds.
- Animals will not be broken down as to color, unless there are 10 or more per sex and color.
- The Cecil County Fair Board encourages all 4-H and open class participants to market themselves and their products, but animals and products entered into the competition at the Fair are NOT to be sold and leave the fair grounds during the Fair week. Animals which are not entered in Fair classes will not be permitted on the fairgrounds at any time, for the health and safety of all exhibitors' animals. If you arrive after this time, you will not be able to compete. Your animal can be housed on your trailer or in the overflow area (space permitting).
- Judging is based on youth's knowledge of their pet, as

Golf Cart Use and Safety Rules

The following rules must be obeyed by all those using golf carts on the fairgrounds. At the first infraction of any of these rules, the driver of the golf cart may be denied permission to drive a cart for the duration of the fair.

1. A \$25.00 fee is due at time you apply. All Golf Cart's/UTV's are subject to visual/mechanical inspection to ensure safe operations while on the fairgrounds. Any Golf Cart/UTV deemed to be unsafe shall NOT be allowed to operate on the fair grounds.
2. Golf Cart's/UTV'S are NOT considered handicapped vehicles. Only wheelchairs and scooters are permitted for this purpose.
3. All drivers MUST have a valid driver's license and be 16 to operate on the fairground. NO EXCEPTIONS.
4. All drivers / Owners must show proof of insurance before a permit is issued. A copy of this will be on file in the fair office. A \$25.00 deposit is required and if you don't break the rules or no incident occurs it will be given back.
5. If you don't have insurance on your Golf Cart/UTV, you cannot operate it on the fairgrounds.
6. Speed shall not exceed 10 mph through the fairgrounds. Only exception is the back entrance. Obey posted speed limit on back entrance.
7. The use of illegal drugs/alcohol is strictly prohibited while operating or riding in a Golf Cart/UTV.
8. The agreement must be signed, copy of Rules and Regulations given and permit given in order to operate a Golf Cart/UTV.
9. The operator of the Golf Cart/UTV is entirely responsible for the safe operations of their Golf Cart/UTV. Any viewed as being operated in an unsafe manner will result in loss of driving privilege for the rest of the fair.
10. Only those Golf Cart's/ UTV'S authorized by the committee will be allowed to operate on fair property. The primary use of the Golf Carts/ UTV is for the operation and maintenance of the fair. If you have a specific reason for bringing one and wish to apply for a permit, then please complete the application for permit. It will be subject for approval or denial by the committee. Remember, it's a privilege, not a right.
11. Any unauthorized Golf Cart/UTV, or similar vehicle being operated on the fairgrounds will be confiscated and parked until the end of fair.
12. Permits must be visible at all times.
13. Golf Carts/UTV's are required to yield to pedestrians, animals and emergency vehicles. Failure to yield will result in loss of driving privilege.
14. Remove your key when the Golf Cart/UTV is not in operation. The Fair Board is NOT responsible for stolen Golf Cart's/UTV or any other item.
15. All Golf Cart's/UTV's must have headlights for night time operations. Dusk is considered Night Time Also. "Four-Wheelers" are not considered a UTV and are not permitted to be operated on the fairgrounds during the fair.
16. Operation of Golf Cart's should be kept to a minimum, especially during the evening when the crowd is large. Please do not drive through the crowd to get somewhere. If you can walk, then walk.
17. Driving through the Mid-way (Carnival) is strictly prohibited during peak hours. Emergencies are only exceptions.
18. The Golf Cart/UTV committee chairperson has the final say and decision regarding any matter involving rules and regulations. NO EXCEPTIONS.
19. The following do NOT need to register their Golf Cart's/UTV's:

 - Garbage Collectors
 - Maintenance Personnel

****Note: ALL general herdsman rules apply to the Horse Herdsman competition, in addition to the following rules.**

1. To be eligible to enter the Herdsman class, 4-Hers must enter a Grooming & showmanship class.
2. If you were a 4-H member in 2014, you must have completed a record book in 2014 year. Note: If you are a new member in 2015, you must complete a 2015 record book to be eligible to compete in Horse Herdsman during 2016.
3. Tack stalls will be limited to 2 exhibitors per stall, pending availability.
4. SWITCHING OF STALLS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED.
5. All displays MUST be completed and all horses must be in place by 7pm on Sunday July, 26.
6. Judging will take place between Sunday, July, 26, after 7pm and Saturday, August 1st.
7. Displays may be taken down Sunday, August 2nd at 12 p.m..
8. Horses may leave anytime after 10pm Saturday evening, although it is advised you leave Sunday morning.
9. Open toed shoes will NOT be allowed in the barn area. This applies to all 4-Hers and their chaperons.
10. All 4-Her's must wear approved head gear, long pants & hard soled shoes when ridding.
11. A copy of your NEGATIVE COGGINS MUST BE MAILED with your entries to Jayne Lloyd! Upon arrival at the fair grounds, you must also provide an Equine Self Exam form to the herdsman chair.
12. Sleep stalls MAY be available, depending on entry numbers. Sleep stalls will be released one week prior to fair via email.
12. Supplemental rules will be emailed 1 week prior to fair. These rules along with the general herdsman rules apply.
13. Proper horsemanship and sportsmanship must be exhibited at all times during the fair. If the committee determines a 4- H'er

is not practicing the Animal Science Code of Ethics & 4-H Behavioral Code of Ethics, he or she will forfeit their Herdsman entry.

Equine Exhibitor's Self Certification of Animal Health

I, the undersigned, hereby verify the following:

(Parent or guardian must sign for children under age 18)

1. I am the **owner/authorized caretaker/transporter** (*circle as applicable*) of the equine identified on the current, valid, "Equine Infectious Anemia" (Coggins) document.
2. I understand that any equine showing any signs of or having recent exposure to, contagious or infectious disease are not permitted to enter the fair/show premises. These conditions include but are not limited to the following:
 - SKIN: Visible evidence of skin infections (*bacterial or fungal*) with particular emphasis on *ringworm*.
 - HEAD: Discharge from the eyes or nose which is excessive in amount or opaque (yellow or white in color) as opposed to the normal clear nasal discharge commonly seen after exercise.
 - RESPIRATORY: Signs of infectious respiratory disease such as fever, coughing, labored breathing, increased respiratory rate and nasal discharge. Animals originating from premises where there is current infectious respiratory disease and animals with any known exposure to infectious respiratory disease shall be ineligible to show for a minimum of 21 days after exposure. Infectious respiratory disease shall include but not be limited to *Influenza, Rhinopneumonitis, and Strangles*.
 - INTESTINAL: Evidence of diarrhea which is watery and/or persistent in nature and more profuse than a looser stool which could be attributed to diet or nervousness.
 - FEET: Horses exhibiting any type of unsoundness are already excluded from showing by the rules governing horse for shows.
 - OTHER: Recent exposure to, or clinical signs of, any contagious or infectious disease conditions that would exclude equine from exhibition.
3. I have read and understand the above guidelines.
4. I have visually examined the equine I am presenting for exhibit.
5. I agree not to present for exhibition any equine showing any signs of contagious or infectious disease, or having any known recent (21 days) exposure to any contagious or infectious disease.

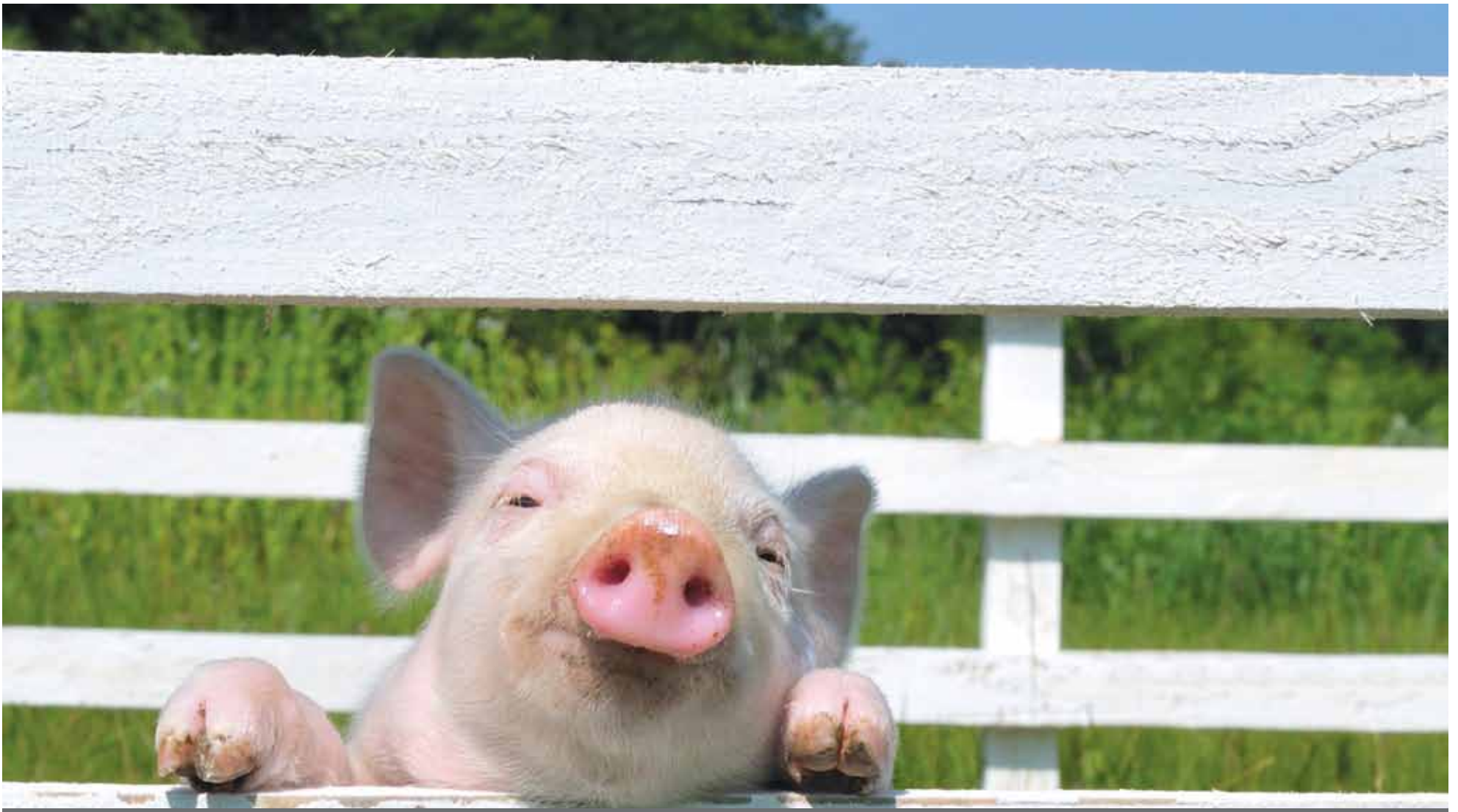
